Please note that the telephone at the Centre is **for emergency use only**; calls will be directed in the first instance to the teacher in charge. Your child will not be allowed to ring home. If you have any concerns, please contact us, in the first instance, at Deansfield. Staff keep in regular contact with Deansfield and a daily text is sent to you with news of the children's activities and the website is updated regularly with information (www.deansfield.greenwich.sch.uk).

Security/Safety: The safety of the children is paramount. The Centre staff are extremely experienced and activities are carried out under their strict supervision. For security reasons, the doors to both centres are locked each evening when children become the responsibility of Deansfield staff. We have well established systems set up to deal with any emergency which may arise during the night; although centre staff do not live on site they are in easy reach should the need arise and are contactable 24 hours a day should we need them.

3. Clothing: Clothing needs to be appropriate to the season but **please remember that it can be cold in the mountains**. The weather can be very unpredictable, so please pack gloves and hats as well as clothes for more clement weather. We have prepared a list of clothes, which the Centre considers essential (you no longer have to provide Wellington boots and anoraks as the Centre provides these). **We strongly suggest that you make a list of your child's clothing and attach it to the inside of their suitcase; please label all your child's equipment. Please also send a black plastic bag for muddy clothes!**

4. Other items to pack:

- Personal items such as Ipods, DVD players and DS's **which must be the children's responsibility**– can be taken for the journey; these however will be stored for the week and returned to the children for the journey back. The children will have no time for these items whilst they are away!
- Cameras: the disposable type (with flash) are excellent and simple to use
- Please remember **to pack a duvet cover, pillow case and single sheet.**
- Insect repellent (either spray or cream).

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5. Medicines – If your child needs medication, please ensure that it is in a bag, **clearly labelled with your child's name and the dosage required**. This should be handed to the school office the week before they go. If your child requires travel sickness pills, please ensure they have taken them before they leave – also provide us with the appropriate dose for the return journey, together with any spares for travelling around in the coach whilst in Wales.

6. If your child has any worries which are likely to affect their school journey (other than the normal slight concern about being away from home), please let your class teacher know before they leave.

7. Travelling – Children should arrive at the school at **7.45am**. The coach will leave at **8.00am at the latest**. Staff will have a supply of fruit sweets and peppermints for the journey. Your child will need a packed lunch and a drink on the journey down; this is provided on the return journey.

8. Pocket Money: We have incorporated £5 pocket money into the cost of the journey; there is a Craft Centre near the site where the children may buy a keepsake.

9. Swimming: As a treat, we take the children swimming at the local indoor pool, which is included in the price of School Journey (one piece costumes for the girls please!). We will ask you nearer the time about your child's swimming ability.

10. CHILDREN SHOULD NOT BRING MOBILE PHONES

11. Please ensure you complete the **Consent/Medical Form** and return it to the school office with your payment slip. Your child will not be allowed to go on school journey without it being completed and returned. If a medical condition occurs nearer to the time of the school journey, please let the school office know.

12. Please ensure you make full payment before your child leaves for School Journey. If you vary from the payment plan you chose, please let the school office know. Payments should be made via AGORA, the online payment facility.

13. Postcards: we need to be sure that the children receive a postcard from you whilst they are away. Please ensure you complete a postcard and bring it to the school office the week before the journey together with a stamped addressed postcard which your child may use to write to you. Please make sure that the message is upbeat – we don't want to instil homesickness where it wasn't there before!

We have a fun filled, activity packed week planned for the children which we are sure they will enjoy!

SCHOOL JOURNEY WALES - 16th – 20th October 2017

The cost of the school journey to Wales this year will be **£355**. This cost includes the return transport to and from Wales, accommodation, all meals and use of facilities, local coach hire, and the visits to the local swimming pool.

We would like you to commit yourself to a method of payment. Full payment must be made before your child departs for school journey. Once you have indicated your child wishes to attend, we will advise the Centre to confirm the booking; we have been told by the Centre that they will levy a charge once the confirmation is received.

PAYMENTS SHOULD BE MADE USING THE OLIVE PAYMENT SYSTEM AGORA. Please contact the school office if you have not yet registered for this system or need to make payment by alternative means.

AGORA is checked daily for payments to the system. Please let us know if you decide to vary your chosen payment plan.

Please indicate how you intend to pay:

1. **One off payment of £355 as soon as possible.** Please indicate when you will make your payment.

2. **Six monthly payments:**

1. April 2017 –	payment £60
2. May 2017 –	payment £60
3. June 2017 –	payment £60
4. July 2017 -	payment £60
5. August 2017 –	payment £60
6. September 2017 -	payment £55

Please make regular monthly payments to ensure you are on schedule.

3. **Sixteen Weekly payments: 15 x £22, 1 x £25** – please make regular weekly payments to ensure you are on schedule, starting week ending 5th May.

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Grants are also available which help cover the bed and breakfast element of the journey if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Income Support,
- Income-Based Job Seekers Allowance,
- Income Based Employment Support Allowance,
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration Asylum Act 1999,
- Child Tax Credit with a household income under £16,190.00,
- Pension Credit Guarantee,
- Working Tax Credits,
- Child Tax Credit above the Basic Family Element.

However you will still need to pay **£231** to cover the cost of the travel, the difference between the amount of grant available and the centre cost, local coach hire, £5 pocket money and swimming costs.

If you are sure that you are in receipt of one of the benefits listed above, please indicate below if you wish to make an application for the grant; the school office will be happy to process this for you. Please ensure that you have available to the school office proof of the benefit making you eligible for the grant.

Please complete off the slip attached and return it to the Office by 2nd May 2017, so that we are aware of your preferred method of payment; we will expect you to keep to the schedule you have indicated. Please also ensure that the **consent form** is completed and returned to the school office with the slip below.

If you have any queries please do not hesitate to contact the school office. We are sure the children will enjoy the fun, action packed week we have arranged for them. 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TYN Y BERTH MOUNTAIN CENTRE CHECKLIST

PLEASE ENSURE THAT ALL GROUP MEMBERS RECEIVE A COPY.

THE CENTRE WILL PROVIDE: WATERPROOF TROUSERS AND JACKETS, WELLIES, WALKING BOOTS AND ALL SPECIALIST OUTDOOR GEAR.

Bring clothing that you don't mind getting WET and DIRTY! Fashion items often get ruined.

For Activities.

- 3 pairs of trousers – loose fitting tracksuit trousers are best. Cargo pants are good and jogging bottoms ok. NO JEANS.
- 3 jumpers or fleeces – SYNTHETIC FLEECES ARE BEST. Hoodies and sweatshirts are ok but when cotton gets wet it gets COLD!!!
- 3 shirts or thermal tops, long sleeved is ideal. Nylons and polyesters... football style shirts because they dry quickly when wet. Cotton isn't so good because it gets wet, heavy and cold.
- 4 pairs of thick socks. Wool or wool mix is best. They prevent blisters when you wearing walking boots too!
- Boots – we provide solid, hard wearing walking boots. Bring your own if you prefer.
- A pair of OLD trainers, which you don't mind getting wet or muddy.
- Jacket – always useful.
- Gloves and Hats – It can even get cold in July in the mountains!
- Torch – good for the nightwalk.
- Swimming costume – if your group is going swimming.
- Sun hat – baseball hat, etc for those rare hot Welsh days.
- Insect repellent- midgies in summer can be a pain.
- Sun cream.
- **A water bottle** – preferably one which holds **1 litre and a lunch box.**

FOR INSIDE THE CENTRE

Personal medication.

Footwear must be worn inside the centre.

Wash kit – towel, toothbrush and paste, etc...

Pyjamas, onesie, dressing gown and slippers.

Trainers – good for some activities.

Casual clothing for the evenings, and remember several changes of underwear and socks.

Bedding – please bring a single sheet, pillow case and duvet cover.

EXTRAS – pocket money, cameras...

Luggage – Suitable travel cases and bags. Must be clearly labeled with NAME, ADDRESS and SCHOOL – inside and out.
